## Smallest size pdf reader for android

PDF apps for reading have always been neck pain. Generally speaking, there are two main cases of using PDF files. The first is for a business where you can create forms in PDF format and people fill them out. Second, to read e-books. PDF is an easily accessible file that works well for reading. Typically, PDF reading apps serve only one of two such usages, and in this list we've compiled a selection of the best PDF reading apps on Android for both. They allow you to do things like open PDF files, fill them out if it's a form, sign your name, annotate and other similar functions. They are most useful for business professionals, students or those who fill out forms and send them back via email or otherwise online. Some typical examples of this include Adobe Acrobat Reader and DocuSign. Some apps, such as CamScanner, add features such as document scanning and fax to additional functionality and usability. Another type of PDF-readers for recreational use. Many people format e-books in PDF format. The correct PDF reader for books includes features such as chapter support, reading mode, various scrolling modes, and other similar features. Apps on this list like that include Google Play Books, and Moon Reader. These apps almost always support other types of e-books as well. This list has PDF apps for both types. There is a third type as well. All-in-one style apps include PDF support along with other features. For example, CamScanner and Fast Scanner are actually applications for document scanner applications with built-in PDF-reading functionality. These apps are perfectly under happy to kill two birds with one stone, and are also excellent under glad for people who don't want a ton of apps but want all the functionality. We have several apps like that as well on this list. Adobe Acrobat ReaderPrice: Free/\$12.99-\$14.99 per monthAdog Acrobat Reader is the default choice for many people. Most of the time it just works. The app also has other features, including the ability to annotate and take notes on PDF files, fill out forms, some cloud storage support, and sign your signature. You'll also get a complete experience of material design and support for 18:9 displays along with other side ratios. It's obviously more for business or professional use than reading PDF books or anything like that, so we recommend it just for this case use. There is a subscription cost that unlocks features along with Adobe's Creative Cloud storage. It's not bad for your basic stuff. CamScannerPrice: Free /\$4.99-\$6.99 per month/Additional purchases in the CamScanner app is one of the most powerful PDF READERS and creators. It can import PDF files. This is just the tip of the iceberg. It can also scan physical documents in pdf files on your phone. It has many features to improve the scanning process helps make some clean, clear documents. You can annotate PDF files, share them with anyone, or even fax them for a nominal fee. The paid route brings additional features such as 10GB of

cloud space, some editing features and more. The free version should do well enough for simple things, however. DocuSignPrice: Free/\$10-\$40 per month (three plans) DocuSign is a PDF reader for use in business. The main function of the app is to open the documents, let you fill them out, sign them and send them to where they should go. This part of the app is free. There are also several subscription plans, \$10 a month gives you a few extra features. A \$25- and \$40-a-month subscription just to draw on that. Frankly, you really don't need to worry about subscriptions if you do things like this professionally. Fast ScannerPrice: Free/\$2.99Fab Scanner is another PDF scanner application, but it's not as hard as a CamScanner. This is a great, simple app that will scan documents using a smartphone camera and turn them into JPEG or PDF files for future use. It comes with a variety of features to help sharpen and clean the scan as much as possible before earning anything. You can then use any PDF reading app to view it yourself. Most of the features, and all the important ones, are available in the free version. You can also get the premium version for free with Google Play Pass.Foxit PDF ReaderPrice: Free/\$0.99Foxit is very similar to ezPDF. Both boast all-in-one solutions for using PDF. It has an organization system to keep your PDF files in line. You'll also get ConnectedPDF support, the ability to fill out PDF files, and support for PDF certificates, passwords, and Microsoft RMS. This is a good multi-acoustic option when you factor in reading features as well. It's mostly for business use while ezPDF is more fun reading, but it works great for reading too. Foxit also offers an app specifically for use in the business, which costs \$15.99. This version costs just \$0.99.Google PDF ReaderPrice: FreeGoogle PDF Reader is a plug-in for Google Drive. The plug-in gives native PDF SUPPORT for Google Drive users. This is not the most powerful PDF reading app. However, you can open and view PDFs as needed. You can also type, search and copy from PDF files. It also works as a standalone app for those who need something very simple, but don't use Google Drive exclusively. There isn't much else about it, honestly. It opens and allows you to read through PDF files, and that's all it does. The app works great for easy cases of use. Play BooksPrice: FreeGoogle Play Books is Google's answer to The Amazon Kindle. You can buy different books from the store and read them everywhere. It can also read PDF files. There is no business use here - it's just for the fun of reading. You can also upload PDF (and EPUB) files to the cloud to access them on different devices. Books become a part of your library, like any other book. It's a great way to consolidate a great collection beyond that allows you to buy more books. The app is free, but you can spend money on books in the store, obviously. Google has another PDF reader who works with its Google Drive Suite called Google PDF Viewer. This is not bad for super basic usage cases. LibreraPrice: Free (with ads)Librera is one of the most interesting PDF reader applications. It seems to change dramatically every time we update this list. These days, the app bills itself as an all-in-one e-book reader. It supports more than a dozen formats, including PDF, EPUB, EPUB3, MOBI, DJVU, SIP, TXT and others. It also has a modern design, night and day mode to facilitate reading at night, and more. You can even listen to books using text-to-speech if you really want to. The app is a bit buggier than most others on this list, but it's also completely free (with advertising). They also have another PDF reader in Google Play. It goes under the boring name PDF Reader and also works very well. Microsoft WordPrice: Free /\$6.99-\$9.99 per monthMicrosoft Word is one of the most powerful word processors on a mobile phone or desktop. The app also supports PDF files. You can create PDF files and save them as this type of file or open PDFs and view them through the app. Of course, Word does a lot of other things as well including word processing, things like resume construction, and more. In addition, it even has features for reading e-books and other similar cases of using PDF. It's a decent all-in-one solution for those who need a PDF reader as well as a word processor. MiXplorer SilverPrice: \$4.49MiXplorer Silver is an all-in-one file explorer. It does all your usual browser file stuff. This includes reviewing files, opening different types of files, working with archives, and supporting most types of media sources. What makes this special is its support of all types of things through plugins. It has the support of e-book formats along with THEFS. A separate (free) plug-in adds support to THER-reader MiXplorer Silver and a decent e-book reader experience with it. It's not the most elegant solution for reading e-books, but it's a good way to kill a few birds with one stone. The main app is \$4.49. PDF add-ons (and all other add-ons) are free. Moon ReaderPrice: Free /\$4.99 with in-app purchasesMoon' Reader is one of the most popular e-book readers. It has a boatload of features such as support theming, tons of visual options, auto-scrolling, intelligent paragraphs, double page mode (for landscape), and more. The app also supports a bunch of formats such as EPUB, EPUB3, and, of course, PDF. It has the occasional rough edges, but it is one of the best options for those who PDF books. OfficeSuitePrice: Free/\$29.99 OfficeSuite is one of the most popular office apps on a mobile phone. He can do a lot of things. There is support for documents (including from Microsoft Office), spreadsheets, presentations, and even PDF files. The functionality of the PDF is pretty much just business focused. You can fill out forms, sign them and add/access access Functions. This is a good option for those who need a traditional office application with PDF support. The premium version is pretty expensive, though. PDF Viewer ProPrice: FreePDF Viewer is a simple, basic PDF reading app. It has all the basic features, including annotations, cloud support, zoom, bookmarks and more. The pro version adds themes, multiple customization options, and a merging document in one PDF. You'll also get a material design and a somewhat lightweight user interface in general. We didn't have any problems during our testing. However, some have reported a random performance error. Fortunately, the free version is free, obviously, so you can try without paying anything. It's above average, but more powerful options are available. WPS OfficePrice: Free/\$29.99 per year WPS Office (formerly Kingsoft Office) is another all-in-one office solution. It's basically an office application and deals with various documents, spreadsheets and the like, but also comes with PDF features. You can convert different documents into PDF and view PDF files in your native language. This is useful if you have a form or something that should be in a more formal format. It's not too heavy on PDF features, but if you need an office app and a PDF reader, it's a good way to kill two birds with one stone. The subscription adds a few additional useful features and removes ads. It's not entirely necessary, though. Xodo PDF ReaderPrice: FreeXodo is probably the best fully free PDF reader. It boasts fast loading and smooth navigation. You can also fill out pdf forms, sign them and keep a signature for use in the future. It also has support for notes, bookmarks, cloud storage, file management, and more. You can even take notes on empty PDF files if you really want to. It has a surprisingly large number of features, given that it is free without in-app purchases. We also like that it works for both business and recreational use. There doesn't seem to be any advertising either. Honestly, we can't find much wrong with it.
